Under the theme "Empowering People with Disabilities through Innovative Mental Health Initiatives and Inclusive Rehabilitation for Sustainable Change."

This conference stands out for its focus on integrating mental health within disability rehabilitation, fostering collaboration among global experts, and inspiring innovative approaches. By addressing critical challenges faced by disability communities, WDRC 2025 aims to promote inclusivity, resilience, and sustainable advancements that enhance the well-being and rights of individuals with disabilities worldwide. The event brought together a diverse group of scholars, researchers, activists, and practitioners from across the globe to engage in a comprehensive exploration of global feminisms, examining both the theoretical and practical dimensions. The gathering provided a platform for the development of collaborative partnerships, facilitated publishing opportunities, and contributed to advancing the discourse on achieving a more equitable and just world.





Conference overview

For 2025, the 10th World Disability and Rehabilitation Conference (WDRC) was held under the theme, "Empowering People with Disabilities through Innovative Mental Health Initiatives and Inclusive Rehabilitation for Sustainable Change." This theme was thoughtfully designed to address the most pressing topics within the field of disability and rehabilitation in today's world. In alignment with this theme, the paper submission tracks spanned a broad range of topics.

Research Paper Presentations

Key highlight of the conference was the extensive range of high quality research papers presented by seasoned academics, students, practitioners and industry representatives. These contributions underscored the conference's commitment to academic excellence and real-world applicability, offering insights that bridged theory, policy, and practice. Paper Presentations covered a broad spectrum of topics, including, but not limited to;

In addition to standard Q&A, each technical session included a dedicated time slot known as Technical Dialogue, a structured discussion space designed to promote collective reflection and cross-presentation synthesis. These segments provided an opportunity for presenters to engage in shared discussions on emerging themes, methodological challenges, and policy implications raised by the session's papers.

The most significant number of papers came from Asia, underscoring the region's growing academic engagement. COLLABORATIONS & NETWORKING

Collaborations and Networking were at the heart of WDRC 2025. The conference featured a variety of opportunities for presenters and attendees to connect, including the exclusive Partner Networking Space - Bilateral Academic Forum, which ran across all two days. An Open Networking Space on Day one created room for engaging dialogue among participants and resource people, while informal interactions during breaks and meals added further opportunities to form lasting professional relationships. These platforms positioned WDRC as a hub for cross-sector and cross-border collaboration in the field of Disability and Rehabilitation.

01. Bilateral Academic Forum – Powered by TIIKM at WDRC 2025

As part of the Bilateral Academic Forum at the 10th World Disability and Rehabilitation Conference (WDRC 2025), a series of bilateral and multilateral meetings were successfully conducted with the aim of strengthening academic collaboration and fostering international partnerships.

Forum Overview:

The Forum provided a structured platform for universities, research institutions, healthcare organizations, and academic professionals to engage in purposeful one-on-one discussions. These engagements facilitated the exchange of expertise, the identification of collaborative research opportunities, and the development of long-term institutional linkages.

TIIKM's Role:

Through this initiative, TIIKM reaffirmed its role as a facilitator of global academic networking. The Forum advanced TIIKM's mission to cultivate sustainable partnerships and promote impactful dialogue in the areas of disability studies, rehabilitation, mental health and beyond.

Outcomes:

- Strengthened international academic and professional networks.
- Recognition of new avenues for strategic research collaboration.





A meeting was held with delegates from the College of Engineering, Al-Nahrain University. Iraa. and Mr. Nekram Upadhyay, an assistive technology expert from India and representative of the International Center for Research on Assistive Technology and Accessibility (i-CReAT). The discussion centered on collaborative research and initiatives in the field of orthotics, with a focus on bridging academic expertise and practical application.



TIIKM also facilitated a meeting between the Director of Research at Al-Nahrain University, Iraq, and the exclusive conference sponsors, The Rock Creek Foundation and The Affiliated Santee, USA. The discussions focused on potential collaborations in the fields of mental health and survivor support, creating opportunities for impactful joint initiatives.


